Rules (revised January 2014)

1. The competition is confined to male members of member clubs.
2. The competition to be run on a knockout basis in conjunction with Perthshire B. Ass. As passed at the Perthshire B. Ass. A.G.M. on 28/11/1992 and played under World Bowls Laws of the Sport Current Edition.
3. No member of a club may play in this competition while representing another constituent club in any other Perthshire Bowling Association competition in any one season.
4. Early rounds to be played on neutral greens on Friday evenings.
5. Last sixteen teams to play on Methven green.
6. The competition will consist of Singles / Pairs / Triples / fours.
 - The singles to be 21 shots with 4 bowls each player.
 - The pairs to be 17 ends with 4 bowls each player.
 - The triples to be 15 ends with 3 bowls each player.
 - The fours to be 17 ends with 2 bowls each player .
7. Team captains or the umpire will toss a coin to decide on possession of the jack at the first end.
8. Two trial ends will be played in all games.
9. Burnt ends do not count as an end.
10. The ten players representing the club in the semi final must play in the final although players may change positions .
11. Singles will start 30 minutes after the other games.
12. In the event of inclement weather or unforeseen circumstances and on the umpires decision 11 or more ends will constitute a game , scores will be taken at the least number of ends played including singles. Up to and including the 10th end the game will be rearranged by the host club. scores will continue from when the games were stopped. Two trial ends will be allowed in rearranged games.
13. Two points will be awarded for each game won ,should the points and shots be equal then the winner of the singles will decide the result .

13. Greys and whites or club colours to be worn at all times . All players must be dressed the same.

14. The winners of the competition will represent the Perthshire Bowling Ass. In the following years Scottish Inter County Top Ten competition.
